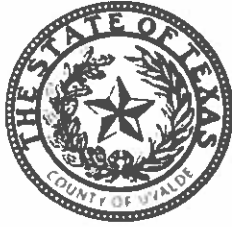

UVALDE COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL ORDER NO. 2023-

**AN ORDER OF THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF UVALDE COUNTY, TEXAS,
TO PROHIBIT DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE AND PROVIDE PENALTIES
PURSUANT TO CHAPTERS 821 AND 826 OF THE TEXAS HEALTH & SAFETY
CODE, AND THE ORDER HEREWITH.**

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Uvalde County is authorized by Chapter 821 of the Texas Health & Safety Code to enact a local order relating to the unlawful restraint of dogs and to the treatment of animals; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Uvalde County is authorized by The Rabies Control Act of 1981, specifically including the authority granted in Chapter 826 of the Texas Health & Safety Code, to enact a local order to require rabies vaccinations and other measures as a means to prevent the dangerous spread of rabies; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Commissioners Court to enact a local order in an effort to protect the public health and safety of Uvalde County residents and encourage the humane treatment of animals;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF UVALDE COUNTY, TEXAS, that the following provisions be adopted this the ___ day of _____, 2023.

Section 1 Dogs Prohibited from Running at Large.

- a) The owner or custodian of a dog shall restrain the animal and prevent it from running at large. Each unrestrained, unowned, or stray dog or cat is hereby declared a public nuisance. For purposes of this Section, "restrained" shall mean that the dog is: physically restrained by a leash, fence, pen, or other device; or physically located on the property of the owner or custodian.
- b) When the owner of a dog running at large is determined and the owner can reasonably be located, the animal shall be returned to its owner and the owner may be cited for violation of this Order.
- c) When the ownership is in question or if the animal is a stray, the animal may be impounded for seventy-two (72) hours, not counting weekends and holidays. An owner may claim the dog within this time period after paying all incurred costs and impoundment fees. Upon failure of the owner to claim the dog during the impound period, the animal be placed for adoption or humanely destroyed without compensation to the owner.
- d) Alternatively, if the animal is not impounded, it may be held and fostered by Briscoe Animal Resource Center of Uvalde (BARC) or its successors. In such case, the animal may be posted on the Uvalde County Website for a period of ten (10) calendar days. An owner may claim the animal within this time period after paying all incurred costs and impoundment fees. Upon failure

of the owner to claim the dog during the impound period, the animal may be placed for adoption or humanely destroyed without compensation to the owner.

e) Recognizing that the resources of Uvalde County are limited, this order does not impose any obligation for Uvalde County or Briscoe Animal Resource Center of Uvalde, or its successors, to pick up, foster or impound any specific animal.

Section 2 Elimination of Stray Animals

a) When practical, any animal subject to these regulations that is found to be a stray may be impounded or held in foster by BARC or its successors. The animal may be impounded for seventy-two (72) hours, not counting weekends and holidays.

b) Sick or injured animals wearing no apparent identification through which ownership can be determined may be kept O to seventy-two (72) hours at the discretion of the Uvalde County Sheriff's Office..

c) If, by rabies tags or other means, the owner of an impounded animal can be identified, best efforts shall be used to immediately, upon impoundment or foster, notify the owner by direct contact, telephone, mail, or other reasonable means.

d) Subject to citation for violation of this Order, an owner may claim the animal within the impoundment period after paying all incurred cost and impoundment fees. Upon failure of the owner to claim the animal during the impoundment period, the animal may be placed for adoption or humanely destroyed without compensation to the owner.

e) Alternatively, if the animal is not impounded, it may be held and fostered by BARC or its successors. In such case, the animal may be posted on the Uvalde County Website for a period of ten (10) calendar days. An owner may claim the animal within this time period after paying all incurred costs and impoundment fees. Upon failure of the owner to claim the dog during the impound period, the animal may be placed for adoption or humanely destroyed without compensation to the owner

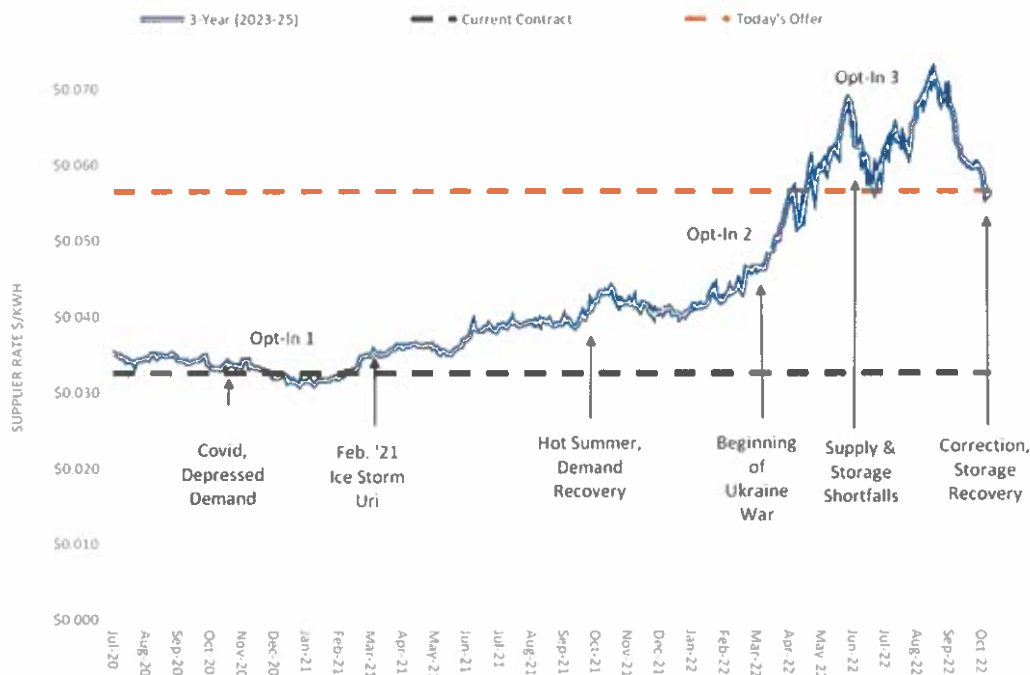

Re: Transaction Report for Public Power Pool's New 2022 Procurement

On October 26, 2022, P3 executed a three-year agreement with MP2 Energy Texas LLC d/b/a Shell Energy Solutions for electricity supply covering years 2023 through 2025 for P3 members. The winning bid is a fixed weighted three-year average price of \$57.4/MWh (or 5.74 cents/kWh) for the group. This represents a projected three-year increase of 39.9% in total electricity costs compared to 2022. The executed rate is an average 1.5% improvement on our target rates, and 26.1% below our ceiling rates as shown in the revised procurement proposals that were sent to members in August, 2022.

The total value of the contract for all 94 members is \$179M for approximately 1,935,780 MWh over the three-year term. A conservative analysis concludes that, had P3 members procured power on their own, the average price would have been 6.41 cents/kWh. The savings from working together is \$4.3M a year.

In order to enter the market at an opportune time, the procurement began well in advance of the end of our current contract. In June 2020 we issued a market solicitation to every retail electric provider in Texas. P3 members received and evaluated our proposal and committed their loads to the procurement. However, the group's imminent entry into the marketplace was hampered by Winter Storm Uri in February 2021 and the P3 Board instructed us to suspend the initial procurement due to market volatility.

P3 subsequently re-issued procurement proposals to all members in February 2022 and then re-calibrated our estimated rates in August 2022 due to continued market volatility as a result of supply/demand imbalances, market reorganization, retailer uncertainty, and the war in Ukraine.

After receiving indicative pricing and input from P3's Technical Committee, on October 5, 2022 the P3 Board authorized us to seek pricing from the following four qualified suppliers:

- Champion
- Constellation
- MI TX
- MP2/Shell Energy

Final executable bids were reviewed by the Technical Committee on October 26, 2022 along with our recommendation that, with only modest benefit from a longer term, a three-year contract was the group's best option. Based on the Technical Committee's recommendation, the P3 Board subsequently approved awarding all pricing pools for a three-year term to the lowest bidder, MP2 Energy.

2023-25 Contract Terms and Conditions

The P3 contract continues to be the strongest and most member-friendly contract in the marketplace. Our bulk purchasing strategy leverages the stability of the membership and provides benefits in the form of security, service and price. We originate the terms and conditions of the contract and the upcoming agreement with MP2 contains all the protections and membership advantages that we expect:

- Elimination of penalties due to over/under consumption;
- No minimum usage requirements per account;
- Enhanced supplier performance metrics and enforcement penalties;
- Symmetrical treatment of default and termination provisions;
- At-contract pricing for small load adds, market competition for large load adds managed by P3;
- Formal mediation mechanisms to resolve switching/billing disputes;
- Member access to a voluntary price response program that rewards load curtailment;
- Allowance for swapping conventional energy resources for renewables at member discretion; and
- A net metering provision establishing a path to market participation for members that employ onsite generation/storage and unfettered member access to demand-side programs and energy efficiency measures.

Improved Contract Security

As in past contracts, the winning supplier was required to post collateral or offer a guarantee from a credit-worthy entity in support of the deal to contain our exposure to adverse market conditions in the event of a bankruptcy. This transaction is secured by a guarantee from Shell Energy, which would take effect in the event that MP2 is unable to support the contract for any reason.

Your New Contract Is Structured to Give Members Budget Certainty

Please see attached, your entity's new Forward Budget Report which estimates costs based on the new contract's fixed rate and your entity's projected kWh usage. The energy portfolio is a fixed-price product with a nodal congestion cost fixed for the North, South, and Houston zones, and passed through for the West zone, since this has been the most cost-effective approach. Any member that prefers to pay a premium to fix line losses and UFE can do so within the terms of the contract. The new contract also contains a renewable offering within 110% of the cost of conventional power for Dallas County, and a Block and Index product for Collin and Nueces counties.

The number of participating members in the P3 aggregation has increased from 90 to 94 since the last time we procured electricity for the group. By working together, P3 members have saved over \$178M against market prices since program inception in 2002. We look forward to continuing this record of savings under the new three-year contract for 2023 - 2025.



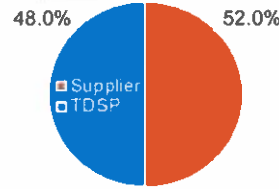

- WHEREAS** Section 352.110 of the Texas Tax Code outlines and restricts the use of revenue generated from the county hotel occupancy tax; and
- WHEREAS** The Texas Hill Country River Region is the contracted vendor for the County of Uvalde to operate and manage the expenditure of the hotel occupancy tax collected within the County of Uvalde; and
- WHEREAS** The Texas Hill Country River Region is seeking to amend Section 352.110 of the Texas Tax Code to allow for additional usage of the collected; and
- WHEREAS** The County of Uvalde, through the Uvalde County Commissioners Court, agrees with the amendments recommended by the Texas Hill Country River Region and urges the bill to be enacted as follows:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the use of county hotel occupancy tax revenue.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 352.110, Tax Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 352.110. USE OF REVENUE; CERTAIN COUNTIES LOCATED WHOLLY IN EDWARDS AQUIFER AUTHORITY.

(a) A county authorized to impose a tax by Section 352.002(a)(15) may use the revenue from the tax only as follows:

(1) [~~75 percent of the revenue~~] for the promotion of tourism and lodging; [~~and~~]

(2) for a convention center facility; and

~~[-2-]~~ (3) notwithstanding Section 352.1015, not more than 25 percent of the annual revenue for:

(A) the removal of trash and litter in the state-owned rivers and riverbeds located within the boundaries of the county; ~~and~~

(B) the provision and maintenance of litter containers on or adjacent to state-owned rivers and riverbeds primarily used by lodging guests and located within the boundaries of the county~~[-]~~; and

(C) for a private entity to contract for the provision of security personnel for events and activities directly related to tourism activity occurring along and adjacent to state-owned rivers and riverbeds that are primarily used by lodging guests and located within the boundaries of the county. This amount may not constitute more than -- percent of the total hotel tax collected annually by the county.

(b) Hotel occupancy tax revenue used under subsection (a) (3) may not be used for general governmental purposes or any other law enforcement costs other than the private contract costs under subsection (a) (3) (C).

(c) If a county to which this section applies uses revenue derived from the tax imposed under this chapter for a purpose described by subsection (a) (3) (C), the county shall determine the amount of annual revenue the county receives from any applicable permit, license or similar fees related to the use of county

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

Racial Profiling

The Uvalde County Constables Office Pct. 1 strictly prohibits peace officers employed or holding a reserve commission by the agency from engaging in racial profiling. The chief administrator affirms that the agency complies with the Texas Racial Profiling Requirements shown below. In addition, this agency **did not** receive any complaints with respect to racial profiling in 2022.

Texas Occupations Code 1701.164 specifies that TCOLE collect incident-based data in accordance with the Code of Criminal Procedure Article 2.131 – 2.138. Chief administrators of law enforcement agencies that meet the criteria must submit racial profiling reports to ***their governing body***, as well as TCOLE.

Each agency must file an annual online report by selecting and completing the reporting option that applies to their particular situation. Reports are filed online through **TCLEDDS**. The reporting period for the **previous** year begins on January 1st and ends March 1st.

The Reporting options are:

1. **Exempt** - Agencies that do not routinely make motor vehicle stops should fill out the 1 page online exempt status form. The exempt status report contains agency general public contact information for questions about its racial profiling filing status. Some agencies are not required to file annual reports. A statistical analysis is not required on EXEMPT STATUS.
2. **Full Reporting** - Agencies that routinely perform traffic stops or motor vehicle stops must file by online report. **The online report requires the completion of agency general public contact information and requires completion of both:**
 - A. An **online form** about the numbers of motor vehicles stops made and
 - B. **uploading a separate PDF comparative analysis document containing a statistical analysis of its motor vehicle stops compared to the gender and ethnic population of the agency's reporting area**. The second document must also contain a statement as to if racial profiling complaints were made against the agency and if so, a listing of all racial profiling complaints and the corresponding resolutions. **[Click here for more information](#)**

Please be advised that failure to submit the required report within the designated reporting period may result in license action against the chief administrator and/or civil penalties against the agency under CCP 2.134(g) and 2.1385(a), respectively.

Each agency must file an annual online report by selecting and completing the reporting option that applies to their particular situation. Reports are filed online through TCLEDDS. The reporting period for the **previous** year begins on January 1st and ends March 1st.

The Reporting options are:

1. **Exempt** - Agencies that do not routinely make motor vehicle stops should fill out the 1 page online exempt status form. The exempt status report contains agency general public contact information for questions about its racial profiling filing status. Some agencies are not required to file annual reports. A statistical analysis is not required on EXEMPT STATUS.
2. **Full Reporting** - Agencies that routinely perform traffic stops or motor vehicle stops must file by online report. **The online report requires the completion of agency general public contact information and requires completion of both:**
 - A. An **online form** about the numbers of motor vehicles stops made and
 - B. **uploading a separate PDF comparative analysis document containing a statistical analysis of its motor vehicle stops compared to the gender and ethnic population of the agency's reporting area**. The second document must also contain a statement as to if racial profiling complaints were made against the agency and if so, a listing of all racial profiling complaints and the corresponding resolutions. Please be advised that failure to submit the required report within the designated reporting period may result in license action against the chief administrator and/or civil penalties against the agency under CCP 2.134(g) and 2.1385(a), respectively.
