2023 Texas Statutes

Election Code

Title 4 - Time and Place of Elections

Chapter 43 - Polling Places

Subchapter A. Number and Location of Polling Places

Section 43.007. Countywide Polling Place Program

Universal Citation: TX Elec COde § 43.007 (2023)

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Sec. 43.007. COUNTYWIDE POLLING PLACE PROGRAM. (a) The secretary of state shall implement a program to allow each commissioners court participating in the program to eliminate county election precinct polling places and establish countywide polling places for:

- (1) any election required to be conducted by the county;
- (2) any election held as part of a joint election agreement with a county under Chapter 271;
- (3) any election held under contract for election services with a county under Subchapter D, Chapter 31;

(4) each primary election and runoff primary election if:

(A) the county chair or county executive committee of each political party participating in a joint primary election under Section 172.126 agrees to the use of countywide polling places; or

(B) the county chair or county executive committee of each political party required to nominate candidates by primary election agrees to use the same countywide polling places; and

(5) each election of a political subdivision located in the county that is held jointly with an election described by Subdivision (3) or (4).

(b) The commissioners court of a county that desires to participate in the program authorized by this section shall hold a public hearing on the county's participation in the program. The commissioners court shall submit a transcript or electronic recording of the public comments made at the hearing to the secretary of state. A county that has previously participated in a similar program and held a public hearing on the county's participation in that program is not required to hold a hearing under this subsection.

(c) In conducting the program, the secretary of state shall provide for an audit of the voting system equipment before and after the election, and during the election to the extent such an audit is practicable.

(d) The secretary of state shall select to participate in the program each county that:

(1) has held a public hearing under Subsection (b);

(2) has submitted documentation listing the steps taken to solicit input on participating in the program by organizations or persons who represent the interests of voters;

(3) has implemented a computerized voter registration list that allows an election officer at the polling place to verify that a voter has not previously voted in the election;

(4) uses direct recording electronic voting machines, ballot marking devices, or hand-marked scannable paper ballots that are printed and scanned at the polling place or any other type of voting system equipment that the secretary of state determines is capable of processing votes for each type of ballot to be voted in the county; and

(5) is determined by the secretary of state to have the appropriate technological capabilities.

(e) Each countywide polling place must allow a voter to vote in the same elections in which the voter would be entitled to vote in the county election precinct in which the voter resides.

(f) In selecting countywide polling places, a county must adopt a methodology for determining where each polling place will be located. The total number of countywide polling places may not be less than:

(1) except as provided by Subdivision (2), 50 percent of the number of precinct polling places that would otherwise be located in the county for that election; or

(2) for an election held in the first year in which the county participates in the program, 65 percent of the number of precinct polling places that would otherwise be located in the county for that election.

(g) A county participating in the program must establish a plan to provide notice informing voters of the changes made to the locations of polling places under the program. The plan must require that notice of the location of the nearest countywide polling place be posted on election day at each polling place used in the previous general election for state and county officers that is not used as a countywide polling place.

(h) In adopting a methodology under Subsection (f) or creating the plan under Subsection (g), the county shall solicit input from organizations or persons located within the county who represent minority voters.

(i) The secretary of state may only select to participate in the program six counties with a population of 100,000 or more and four counties with a population of less than 100,000.

(j) Not later than January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the secretary of state shall file a report with the legislature. The report must include any complaints or concerns regarding a specific election that have been filed with the office of the secretary of state before the preparation of the report and any available information about voter turnout and waiting times at the polling places. The report may include the secretary of state's recommendations on the future use of countywide polling places and suggestions for statutory amendment regarding the use of countywide polling places.

(k) Each county that previously participated in a program under this section is authorized to continue participation in the program for future elections described by Subsection (a) if:

(1) the commissioners court of the county approves participation in the program; and

(2) the secretary of state determines the county's participation in the program was successful.

(l) Subsections (b), (c), and (d) do not apply to a county participating in the program under Subsection (k).

(m) In adopting a methodology under Subsection (f), the county must ensure that:

(1) each county commissioners precinct contains at least one countywide polling place; and

(2) the total number of polling places open for voting in a county commissioners precinct does not exceed more than twice the number of polling places in another county commissioners precinct.

(n) To the greatest extent possible, countywide polling places shall be located in a precinct where the political party that received the greatest number of votes in the last gubernatorial election is the same political party with which the presiding judge is affiliated.

(o) Each countywide polling place must post a notice of the four nearest countywide polling place locations by driving distance.

(p) If a court orders any countywide polling place to remain open after 7 p.m., all countywide polling places located in that county shall remain open for the length of time required in the court order.

Update

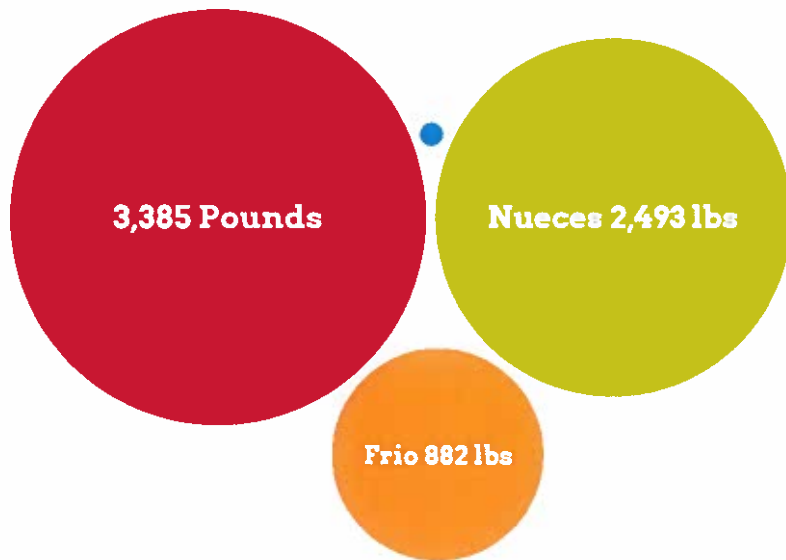

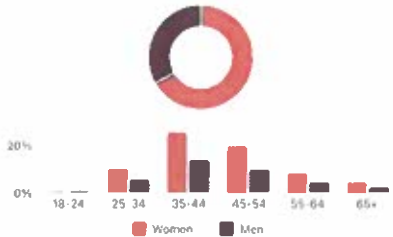

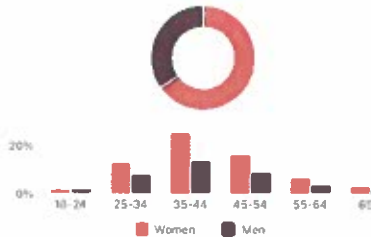

Rock Painting & Summer Star Parties

Rock painting sessions are held every Thursday in June and July at the Uvalde County Visitor Center, providing a creative and fun activity for all ages. Participants can join in to paint and decorate rocks, which can then be taken home as unique keepsakes or placed in the community for others to find.

In addition to rock painting, Summer Star Parties take place on Fridays in June and July at the Uvalde County Visitor Center. These events offer a chance to explore the night sky with telescopes and expert guidance, making for a fascinating and educational evening under the stars.

Both activities are perfect for families and individuals looking to engage in enjoyable summer pastimes.

TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE

Thirty-four thousand people visited Uvalde County for the Total Solar Eclipse. Peak visitor times were between 9 AM and 6 PM, with around ten thousand people staying overnight and twenty-four thousand visiting just for the day. The top locations visited within Uvalde County were Garner State Park, Walmart, HEB, Uvalde Plaza, and local restaurants.

After over two years of preparing for the Total Solar Eclipse, we were surprised that people did not go out as much as expected. It was very clear that the visitors came prepared with their own food and supplies, despite our efforts to communicate that the stores and restaurants were fully stocked and ready for the crowds.

We were thrilled to have Fox29 and Channel 4 News broadcasting live from Concan at Neal's Dining Room, providing full coverage of the Total Solar Eclipse. Their presence added excitement and a sense of importance to the event, capturing the unique atmosphere and the reactions of visitors as they witnessed this rare celestial phenomenon.

To accommodate the influx of visitors, we placed 100 port-a-potties around the county to help with congestion on the roadways. However, we did not see the level of congestion we were expecting until after Totality. It seemed that everyone arrived at different times but all left around the same time. What usually takes about 20 minutes from Concan to Sabinal was reported to be taking around 2 hours.

Although it was a cloudy day, there were parts of the county that managed to get a glimpse of Totality. The cloud coverage was patchy, and while some areas experienced significant cloud cover, others had clearer skies just in time for the eclipse. This made for a mixed experience, with some visitors enjoying a full view of the eclipse and others only catching brief moments of it. Despite the clouds, the event was a remarkable experience for many, highlighting the unique natural beauty of Uvalde County even on a less-than-perfect day.

RULES OF PROCEDURE, CONDUCT AND DECORUM AT MEETING OF THE UVALDE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

- I. All Regular, Special, Emergency and Executive Session Meeting of the Uvalde County Commissioners Court will be called and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Open Meeting Act, Chapter 551, Government Code.
- II. Regular, Special and Emergency Meetings of the Uvalde County Commissioners Court are open to the public and to representatives of the press and media. Executive Sessions of the Commissioners Court are not open to the public, the press or the media and only those individuals expressly requested or ordered to be present are allowed to attend Executive Sessions.
- III. The Uvalde County Commissioners Court meets in Regular Session on the second and fourth Mondays of each month. In order for a matter or issue to appear as an agenda item on the Agenda of any Regular Meeting of the Commissioners Court, a request must be filed and approved by at least one member of the Commissioners Court and/or the County Judge by 12:00 p.m. (noon) on the Tuesday immediately preceding the next Regular Meeting of the Commissioners Court.
- IV. The business of Uvalde County is conducted by and between the members of the Uvalde County Commissioners Court and by those members of the County staff, elected officials, department heads, consultants, experts and/or member of the public requested to be present and participate. While the public is invited to attend all meetings of the Commissioners Court (except Executive Sessions) the public's participation therein is limited to that of observers unless a member (or members) of the public completes a Public Participation Form and submits the same to the County Clerk prior to the time the agenda item (or items) is addressed by the Court.
 - A. Each member of the public who appears before the Commissioners Court shall be limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes to make his/her remarks. Time for each speaker shall be maintained by the County Clerk or such other designated representative of the Commissioners Court. Members of the public, who have properly completed a Public Participation Form and submitted it to the County Clerk, must wait to be recognized before they will be allowed to address the Court.
 - B. Maximum discussion on any agenda item, regardless of the number of numbers of the public wishing to address the Commissioners Court on such agenda item (or items), shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes. In the event that more than ten (10) members of the public wish to address a particular agenda item (or items), then members of the public recognized to speak shall be divided equally between those members of the public wishing to speak

for the agenda item (or items) and those members of the public wishing to speak against the agenda item (or items).

- C. In matters of exceptional interest, the Court may, by the majority vote of the members of the Court in attendance at the meeting, either shorten or lengthen the time allocated for all members of the public and/or the amount of time allocated for all agenda items and/or a specific agenda item.
- D. It is the intention of the Court to provide an open access to the citizens of Uvalde County to address the Commissioners Court and express themselves on issues of County Government. Members of the public are reminded that the Uvalde County Commissioners Court is a Constitutional Court, with both judicial and legislative powers, created under Article V, Section 1 and Section 18 of the Texas Constitution. As a Constitutional Court, the Uvalde County Commissioners Court also possesses the power to issue a Contempt of Court Citation under Section 81.024 of the Texas Local Government Code. Accordingly, members of the public in attendance at any Regular, Special and/or Emergency Meeting of the Court shall conduct themselves with proper respect and decorum in speaking to, and/or addressing the Court; in participating in public discussions before the Court; and in all actions in presence of the Court. Proper attire for men, women and children is mandatory. Those members of the public who are inappropriately attired and/or who do not conduct themselves in an orderly and appropriate manner will be ordered to leave the meeting. Refusal to abide by the Court's Order and/or continued disruption of the meeting may result in a Contempt of Court citation.
- E. It is not the intention of the Uvalde County Commissioners Court to provide a public forum for the demeaning of any individual or group. Neither is it the intention of the Court to allow a member (or members) of the public to insult the honesty and/or integrity of the Court, as a body, or any member or members of the Court, individually or collectively. Accordingly, profane, insulting or threatening language directed toward the Court and/or any person in the Court's presence and/or racial, ethnic, or gender slurs or epithets will not be tolerated. No signs or placards, for or against an issue, shall be allowed in the Commissioners Courtroom. These rules do not prohibit public criticism of the Commissioners Court, including criticism of any act, omission, policy, procedure, program or service. Violation of these rules may result in the following sanctions:
 - 1. Cancellation of speaker's remaining time;
 - 2. Removal from the Commissioners Courtroom
 - 3. A Contempt Citation; and/or
 - 4. Such other civil and/or criminal sanctions as may be authorized by the Constitution, Statutes and Codes of the State of Texas.

- V. All members of the Court and members of the public are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that demonstrates respect towards others and the Court itself. Behavior that impedes or disrupts the business of the Commissioners Court while Court is in session is prohibited and unlawful pursuant to Texas Penal Code Ch. 42.05. It is the intention of the Uvalde County Commissioners Court to attend to County business effectively and efficiently, without undue interruption. All cell phones and other mobile communication devices should be in "silent" mode at all time while Court is in session. No food or drink will be allowed in the Commissioners Courtroom.

- VI. The County Judge is the presiding officer of the Uvalde County Commissioners Court and is a fully participating member thereof. In the event of the absence of the County Judge, the senior member of the Commissioners Court (in terms of total number of years as an elected representative) present at the Regular, Special, Emergency Meeting or Executive Session, shall serve as the Judge Pro-Tem of the Court. However, nothing herein shall prevent the senior member of this Commissioners Court from delegating this duty to another member of the Commissioners Court.
- VII. The County Judge (or the designated Judge Pro-Tem of the Commissioners Court), as presiding officer of the Commissioners Court, is responsible for conducting all meetings. Members of the public who have properly completed a Public Participation Form and submitted same to the County Clerk, must wait to be recognized before they will be allowed to address the Court.
- VIII. Special Rules for the Press and Media:
 - A. No media personnel or equipment, including lights, cameras or microphones will be located on the Commissioners Court bench nor closer than five (5) feet in front of the Commissioners Court bench.
 - B. Reporters and media technicians are required to structure their movements, equipment set-up and take-down and adjustments, etc. in such a manner as to not disrupt the Commissioners Court deliberations or the ability of the public to see, hear, and participate in the proceedings.
 - C. Interviews shall not be conducted inside the Commissioners Courtroom during the time the Court is in session
 - D. Media interviews which are conducted outside the Commissioners Courtroom should be conducted in such a manner that the interview does not disturb, impede or disrupt the proceedings of any Regular, Special, Emergency and/or Executive Session meeting of the Court.
- IX. The Sheriff of Uvalde County, Texas, or his designated deputy, shall serve as the Bailiff at all Regular, Special and Emergency Meetings of the Court. However, in the event of the absence of the Sheriff, or in the event that there exists a conflict of interest between the Sheriff, any member of the Sheriff's office, and the Commissioners Court, or in the event of an Executive Session of the Court in which the Sheriff is not an authorized participant, then the Court shall appoint another commissioned peace officer to serve as Bailiff as may be necessary.
- X. From time to time, the Commissioners Court shall conduct town meetings and public hearings. These rules of procedure, conduct and decorum shall also apply to such town meetings and public hearings, however, the Commissioners Court may adopt such additional and supplemental rules for such meeting as may be necessary and appropriate to conduct such meetings in an orderly, efficient and proper manner.
- XI. These Rules of Procedure, Conduct and Decorum at meetings of the Uvalde County Commissioners Court shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the Court and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or repealed by a majority vote of the Uvalde County Commissioners Court.
