

A RESOLUTION OF THE UVALDE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT REQUESTING THE TEXAS LEGISLATURE AMEND CHAPTER 352 OF THE TEXAS TAX CODE TO ALLOW UVALDE COUNTY TO USE HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX REVENUE FOR ADDITIONAL PURPOSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TEXAS TAX CODE

WHEREAS Chapters 351 and 352 of the Texas Tax Code specifies how counties may expend municipal hotel occupancy tax revenue; and

WHEREAS Uvalde County is an important tourism destination and these tourists greatly benefit the County's economy; and

WHEREAS Uvalde County is determined to further grow the tourism economy; and

WHEREAS Chapters 351 and 352 of the Texas Tax Code enables other counties in Texas to expend county hotel occupancy tax revenue for convention centers, visitor information centers, advertising and promoting tourism activity, arts-related projects and programs attended by tourists and lodging guest, historical restoration and preservation, sporting events in which the majority of the participants are tourists and where there is substantial economic activity at area hotels, and tourism-oriented wayfinding signage; and

WHEREAS Uvalde County now requests the Texas Legislature amend Chapter 352 of the Texas Tax Code to allow Uvalde County to use county hotel occupancy tax revenue in the same manner as other counties, and also for river clean-up;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UVALDE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT THAT:

Section 1. That the Commissioners Court adopts the findings and recitals set forth in the preamble of this Resolution

Section 2. That Uvalde County requests and supports the passage of legislation during the 89th regular session of the Texas Legislature 2025, to amend Chapter 352 of the Texas Tax Code to allow Uvalde County the use of county hotel occupancy tax revenue in the same manner as other counties and also for river clean-up.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the use of hotel occupancy tax revenue by certain counties.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subsection 352.002(d), Tax Code, is amended to read as follows:

- (d) The tax imposed by a county authorized by Subsection (a)(6), (8), (9), (10), (11), (14), (15), [(16),] (17), (19), (20), (21), (23), or (29) to impose the tax does not apply to a hotel located in a municipality that imposes a tax under Chapter 351 applicable to the hotel. This subsection does not apply to:
- (1) a county authorized by Subsection (a)(6) to impose the tax that:
- (A) has a population of less than 50,000 and adjoins the most populous county in this state; or
- $\mbox{(B)} \quad \mbox{has a population of more than 200,000 and} \\ \mbox{borders the Neches River; or} \\$
- (2) a county authorized by Subsection (a)(9) to impose the tax that has a population of more than 11,000.
 - SECTION 2. Chapter 352, Tax Code, is amended by adding

Section 352.116 to read as follows:

Section 352.116. USE OF REVENUE: CERTAIN COUNTIES THROUGH WHICH THE FRIO RIVER FLOWS.

- (a) In addition to the purposes authorized by this chapter, revenue from a tax imposed under this chapter by a county authorized to impose the tax by Section 352.002(a)(16) may be used for:
- (1) the removal of trash and litter in the state-owned rivers and riverbeds located within the boundaries of the county; and
- (2) the provision and maintenance of litter containers on or adjacent to state-owned rivers and riverbeds primarily used by lodging guests and located within the boundaries of the county.
- (b) A county to which this section applies shall annually spend 25 percent of the revenue from the tax authorized by this chapter for purposes authorized under subsection (a).
- SECTION 3. Section 352.110, Tax Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 352.110. USE OF REVENUE; CERTAIN COUNTIES LOCATED WHOLLY IN EDWARDS AQUIFER AUTHORITY. A county authorized to impose a tax by Section 352.002(a)(15) may use the revenue from the tax only as follows:
 - (1) 75 percent of the revenue for the [promotion of tourism

.B. No. and lodging) purposes provided by Section 351.101(a), provided such revenue is used for purposes benefiting unincorporated areas of county; and

- (2) notwithstanding Section 352.1015, 25 percent of the revenue for:
- (A) the removal of trash and litter in the state-owned rivers and riverbeds located within the boundaries of the county; and
- (B) the provision and maintenance of litter containers on or adjacent to state-owned rivers and riverbeds primarily used by lodging guests and located within the boundaries of the county.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
